

Title: Reporting Student Progress

Purpose

The Board recognizes that communication between school and home is a vital component in the growth and education of each student. The Board acknowledges the school's responsibility to keep parents/guardians informed of student welfare and academic progress.[1]

<u>Authority</u>

The Board directs that the district's instructional program shall include a system for measuring all students' academic progress.[2][3][4][5]

The Board directs the Educational Director or designee to establish a system of reporting student progress that includes academic progress reports, grade reports, and parent/guardian conferences with teachers.

Delegation of Responsibility

The Educational Director or designee shall develop administrative regulations for reporting student progress to parents/guardians.

All appropriate staff members, as part of their professional responsibility, shall comply with the systems established for measuring and reporting student progress.[2][3]

Guidelines

Various methods of reporting, appropriate to grade level and curriculum content, shall be utilized.

Both the student and parent/guardian shall receive ample warning of a pending grade of failure, or one that would adversely affect the student's academic status.



Scheduling of parent-teacher conferences shall occur at times that ensure the greatest degree of participation by parents/guardians.

Grade reports shall be issued at intervals of not less than <u>every nine weeks</u>.

Review and evaluation of methods of reporting student progress to parents/guardians shall be conducted on a periodic basis.
